<sup>1</sup> The facility is not required to educate and offer COVID-19 vaccinations to individuals who enter the facility for specific purposes and for a limited amount of time, such as delivery and repair personnel or volunteers who may enter the LTC facility infrequently (meaning less than once weekly).

<sup>2</sup> The vaccine may be offered and provided directly by the LTC facility or indirectly, such as through an arrangement with a pharmacy partner or other appropriate health entity.

<sup>3</sup> If a resident or staff member requests vaccination but missed earlier opportunities for any reason, the facility is expected to offer the vaccine to that individual as soon as possible. If the vaccine is unavailable in the facility, the facility should provide information on obtaining vaccination opportunities (e.g., local pharmacy, health department) to the individual. However, it is expected that the facility will provide evidence, upon request, of efforts made to make the vaccine available to its staff and residents. Similar to influenza vaccines, if there is a manufacturing delay, the facility should provide evidence of the delay, including efforts to acquire subsequent doses as necessary.

<sup>4</sup> Documentation for residents should be maintained in their medical record and should include the date the education and offering took place, while documentation for staff members can be demonstrated by providing a roster of staff that received education (e.g., a sign-in sheet) and the date the education took place.

<sup>5</sup> If a staff member is not eligible for COVID-19 vaccination because of previous immunization at another location or outside of the facility, the facility should request vaccination documentation from the staff member to confirm vaccination status.
